### DNA of bulls

Please be aware that the DNA results take 4 weeks for the results to come back, therefore can you bare this in mind when you are wanting your bull registered as he cannot be registered until the results have come back and are correct.

### Reminder for the 2019 Sales

#### **BVD**—Testing and Vaccination for Registered entries

All Entries MUST be vaccinated against BVD (Bovine Viral Diarrhoea).

- Entries from CHeCS Accredited Herds MUST be fully vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of vaccine used. (Note their last vaccination MUST have been administered within 12 months of the sale).
- Entries from non BVD Accredited Herds MUST be Antigen tested negative and vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of the vaccine used.
- Entries from herds not subscribing to the membership of a CHeCS
  Herd Health Scheme MUST be Antigen tested negative and vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of the vaccine used.
- In the case of pregnant animals they MUST be vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of the vaccine used and vaccination MUST be carried out prior to service.
- Ensure that in all instances the final vaccination has been administered with sufficient time for the animal to have built up an immunity prior to the sale. From advice obtained, at least 4 weeks prior to the sale.

# ENTRIES NOT FULLY VACCINATED FOR BVD WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ENTRY TO THE AUCTION CENTRE.

## Castle Douglas Sale 2017—Show results

A large entry and very good show of quality cattle was paraded before the Judge Mr George Somerville from Dumfries at the annual show and sale of Belted and White Galloway Cattle at Castle Douglas on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018.

There were no cows and calves forward for the show

The other females were split into four classes with the first class being won by Dessy Henry from Northern Ireland with Gruige Holly, Dessy also secured second place with Gruige Harper. Heading the second class Cairnsmore Kacey John from B & J Landers & Son, she was followed in second by Mochrum Justy 8th from Mochrum Estates from Newton



Stewart. The third class of heifers was won by Reaston Hill Justine Torres from J A Wilson who had travelled up from Hexham, in second was Larghill Ultima from local breeder Ian Marshall. The last class of heifers was won by Sir J Keswick with Muil Brook and the second ticket went to Speddoch Billie from Speddoch Farm Partnership.



The female champion and winner of the Borness Rose Bowl was Dessy Henry with his smart homebred incalf heifer Gruige Holly, taking the Reserve spot was Cairnsmore Kacey John from the Landers family.

Not a big entry of bulls but the quality forward made up for this, two senior bulls were forward with first

prize going to Dunay Nicholas from Mrs J Howman and second to him was Glen Gino from Glen Farming Co.

The Junior bull class had a good entry and was split into two classes with the first class being headed by Messrs Ward with Whitstonehill King Thistle, second prize also was won by the Wards with Whitestonehill Gaston. The second class was won by Duncan Maxwell from Drymen with Lomond Tamnavulin, second to him was his stablemate Lomond Bruichladdich

Judge George Somerville had no hesitation in tapping out his champion Bull Lomond Tamnavulin from Duncan Maxwell with Whitestonehill King Thistle taking the Reserve spot. The Belted Galloway champions were kindly sponsored by Tarff Valley.



In the white section there were only two entries with first prize and Champion going to Bergere Dinky 6<sup>th</sup> and second and Reserve Champion going to Bergere Bramble 11<sup>th</sup> both entries from Messrs Traffords.

# Castle Douglas Sale 2018

# Champions in the pre sale show are the top prices in the sale.

A large entry of cattle and a large ringside of breed salwarts and prospective purchasers were in attendance at the Annual Show and Sale of Belted and White Galloway cattle on Friday at Wallets Mart, Castle Douglas. Buyers were present from as far south as Colchester, North as Aberdeen and across the water from Northern and Southern Ireland. Prices had eased back on last year but a realistic trade was achieved.

Male Champion Belted Galloway Lot 68 Lomond Tamnavulin from JM & D Maxwell, Blairvockie, Drymen sold for 6000gns to Hedgeley Farms from Alnwick, Northumberland for her Beanley herd, Tamnavulin is a 21 month old Speddoch Rocky son. Champion & Top



priced Belted Galloway Female was Lot 4 Gruige Holly, a 30 month old in-calf heifer from Dessy Henry, Northern Ireland, selling to Paradise Farmers, Hull, East Yorkshire for 3000gns.

In the Belted Galloway section 5 animals sold in excess of 3000gns. In the bulls the next top price after the Champion was 4500gns which was for Lot 70 from G B Milroy from Newton Stewart and he sold to local breeders Glen Farming Co.

Following that was two lots that made 3000gns the first being the reserve champion Lot 63 Whitestonehill King Thistle, a two year old son of Lomond Tobermory, consigned by the ward family and selling to Mr Saeltzer, Germany. Next at 3000gns was Lomond Bruichladdich another Speddoch Rocky son from Messrs Maxwell selling to fellow breeder Anton Coaker from Yelverton, Devon for his Sherberton Herd.

In the females the next highest price was 2400gns paid for Lot 16 Glen Gypsy an in-calf heifer from Glen Farming Co, selling to new breeders Glencrosh Farming Co from Thornhill, Dumfries. Following her was Mochrum Estates with Lot 20 Mochrum Justy 8<sup>th</sup> selling for 2300gns to Paradise Farmers.

In the White Galloway section there were only two entries from Messrs Traffords from Cumbria, but keen interest in them with Lot 73 Bergere Bramble  $11^{\text{th}}$  selling for 1400gns to Harriet Bunning for her Hatherland Herd in Devon. Lot 74 Bergere Dinky  $6^{\text{th}}$  sold for 1250gns to Anne Bell for her Clifton Herd.
