Reminder for the 2022 Sales

BVD—Testing and Vaccination for Registered entries

All Entries MUST be vaccinated against BVD (Bovine Viral Diarrhoea).

- Entries from CHeCS Accredited Herds MUST be fully vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of vaccine used. (Note their last vaccination MUST have been administered within 12 months of the sale).
- Entries from non BVD Accredited Herds MUST be Antigen tested negative and vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of the vaccine used.
- Entries from herds not subscribing to the membership of a CHeCS
 Herd Health Scheme MUST be Antigen tested negative and vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of the vaccine used.
- In the case of pregnant animals they MUST be vaccinated in accordance with the data sheets of the vaccine used and vaccination MUST be carried out prior to service.
- Ensure that in all instances the final vaccination has been administered with sufficient time for the animal to have built up an immunity prior to the sale. From advice obtained, at least 4 weeks prior to the sale.

ENTRIES NOT FULLY VACCINATED FOR BVD WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ENTRY TO THE AUCTION CENTRE.

If in doubt on any of the points above please consult with either your CHeCS Herd Health provider or your veterinarian.

Carlisle online sale

Boys are in demand

A small entry of Belted Galloways were entered in the online sale, there was a lot of interest and the top bid was 3500gns for Stonehouse Firecracker from SJ & M Richardson & Son. Firecracker is a two year old bull sired by Gruige Firestorm and out of a homebred cow Stonehouse Della, the purchaser was Stephen Mortimer from West Yorkshire and Firecracker joins his Highfarm Herd.

Next top price was 3000gns for Machermore Columbus, a Clifton Hercules son from George Milroy, Columbus joins the Blacklough Herd of Garry Herdman from Alnwick, Northumberland. Next was 2800gns for another bull this time from Hugh Sloan, Burnfoot Picasso is a Clifton Hermes son and he sold to Richard Packer from Morpeth for his Cartington Herd.

Topping the females was the Burnfoot Herd of Hugh Sloan who sold two females for 1800gns each, the first was Burnfoot Phoebe and the second Burnfoot Petal, both were daughters of Clifton Hermes and both sold to William Weightman from Tyne and Wear.

Royal Highland Show

It has been 3 years since we had a Royal Highland Show and the entry of Belties has seen an increase in animals with 33 animals forward from 11 exhibitors making an excellent spectacle of Belted Galloways. Ian Park from Co Durham had the hard task of judging.

The first class was for junior heifers born on or after 1st April 2021 where only one entry was forward and taking the first red ticket of the day was Urrvale Bella from Colin and Nicola Davidson, Bella is a daughter of Bigginvale Odin.

The next heifer class was for females born between 24th June 2020 and 31st March 2021, 6 entries were forward for this class and collecting the first prize rosette here was RKG Farms with Auchengassel Sorana a Speddoch Al sired heifer. Runner up in this class was Mochrum Estates with Mochrum Betty and taking third spot was Brodale Delia Roxy from Lynsey Brown. Following this class, the award for the Best Junior Female was awarded to the winner of the second class Auchengassel Sorana from RKG Farms with Urrvale Bella from C & N Davidson taking Reserve Junior Female.

The senior heifer class for females born between 1st September 2019 and 23rd June 2020 was next with 10 entries and the red ticket here went to J & S Wareham with Tottingworth Mary 1st, a Shelsleys Eros daughter, second prize went to Mochrum Estates with Mochrum Lilas 20th and Third place went to RKG Farms heifer Auchengassel Sollya. Following this class, the Ian B.M. Hamilton trophy for the best heifer was awarded to Tottingworth Mary 1st.

The cow class, for females born before 31st August 2019, presented the judge with a challenge with six quality entries. Leading this class in first place was freshly calved cow Copelaw Isabella from Judith Cowie, this eight-year-old cow was sired by Mochrum Huckleberry, also picking up the Kinrea Trophy for the best cow, Second place went to E & S Hair with their cow Cairnsmore Mariah Johan. Third placed cow went to Clifton Campion from Anne Bell. E & S Hair's calf scooped the John Corrie Perpetual trophy for the best calf at foot. After the cow class the special prize for the best female was won by Tottingworth Mary 1st from J & S Wareham.

On to the bulls and the junior class for bulls born on or after 24th June 2020 featured five entries. First place went to Urrvale Cosmos a Mochrum Keir son from C & N Davidson, second prize went to Alison Taylor with Grassknop Idris, third prize went to Clifton Hurricane from Anne Bell.

Three bulls were forward for the class of bulls born on or before 23rd June 2020 and taking the first prize ticket was Huntfield Wigwam, a Lullenden Aztec Warrior son from Judith Cowie, second prize went to Clifton Dougal and third prize went to Tottingworth Prince from J & S Wareham. Taking the Male Championship was Judith Cowie with Huntfield Wigwam.

This left only the Supreme Championship to decide, and Ian Park could not go past the females and awarded the Championship award to Tottingworth Mary 1st with Copelaw Isabella in Reserve.
